#### **Comments**

Our accounts have shown a small loss of £1086 for this year, with more than enough reserves held to cover this amount. As the expenditure shows, our continuing investment towards our satellite programme (82%), courses and testing.

The County League made a very small profit of £113. It was agreed that 2023/2024 League fees would remain the same, but we will be carefully monitoring any increase in court fee costs over the coming 23/24 season.

We will continue our grant scheme, with 37% of grants paid out this year, while the remaining approved grants are awaiting the relevant paperwork before payment can be made.

## 7. Election of Independent Accountant:

Lesley thanked Claire Darling for her continuing support of the MCNA in her capacity as Independent Accountant. We are grateful that she has agreed to continue in this role next season.

#### 8. Membership Fees for next season:

# Officiating Lead's Report

Another busy and successful season for officiating in Middlesex.

The County officiating community continues to grow with more members attending online courses and working towards their qualifications at all levels. Our experienced and talented umpires have been busy representing Middlesex and our region, London & South East, at competitions and events across the country.

Congratulations to all our amazingly dedicated umpires on their officiating successes and thank you to all our Middlesex umpires, assessors, mentors, tutors and technical officials who are committed to our County and give up their time to ensure Middlesex netball can continue to grow and flourish.

#### **Umpire courses**

All courses continue to be managed and run by England Netball and are delivered online.

With the Into Officiating course and qualification now a compulsory part of the learner pathway, there is huge demand for places on these courses nationally and it can be a challenge to book on. The next batch of courses for October through to March 2024 will be released by England Netball on 23 May.

Following course attendance, learner umpires then need to practice and develop their skills in preparation for assessment. Our lead tutor, Amber Derrien, devised a practical workshop for our Into Officiating learners to attend post-course and this has been rolled out with huge success across the London & South East region. Middlesex have delivered 2 practical workshops with assessment opportunities this season which have been attended by 23 working to Into Officiating umpires.

Next season we hope to see more of our Into Officiating umpires move forward into the C award pathway.

The B award course consists of 2 virtual sessions and a third face to face session. We have a number of umpires who are now progressing to the B umpire award.

### B and A award written assessments

Middlesex continues to support our umpires with their preparation for the B and A written paper. A significant amount of dedication and hard work is required to pass this paper. Workshops have been

held via zoom during April and May for the June 2023 sitting with one to one support sessions also offered to assist with finessing the learning techniques for the paper.

We have 7 Middlesex umpires sitting the B and A written paper assessment at the June 2023 sitting – 3 B and 4 C award umpires. Results are due in July and all these umpires plan to enter the London and South East Regional and Middlesex County mentoring schemes from September to work towards their B and A award qualifications.

#### C Award written assessments

These are now conducted online directly with Europe Netball.

For those attending the new online C courses, the paper is part of the England Netball package they book onto and they are automatically in the system to be offered a paper sitting six months after their course date. Learners can choose to sit the paper earlier if they wish or delay until up to two years after their course attendance.

For those working to C award umpires who attended courses pre COVID-19, they are able to apply direct to Europe Netball to sit the paper. All of these learners have been contacted on more than one occasion this season with the relevant information for them to arrange their C award written assessments.

We currently have 28 working to C award umpires in the system who have yet to take their papers.

#### **Into Officiating Award Assessments**

The Into Officiating award is a basic introduction to the role of an umpire and the fundamentals of the rules of the game of netball. The course attendance is valid for 2 years (some learners who attended pre-Covid have a 22 month extension). After attending the course, learners will gain practical experience via a County run practical workshop or via their schools or clubs. They will then apply for a practical assessment which is usually undertaken on a junior match over a period of 10 to 15 minutes.

This season we have used the younger age junior matches at North London netball league, our workshop afternoons, and also school and club training sessions for these assessments.

We have successfully accredited 26 umpires with the Into Officiating award. Congratulations to:

We still have 56 learners who have previously attended C award courses who are still working towards their qualifications. We will continue to work with these umpires and ensure that those who do wish to qualify can do so before their learning period expires.

We will be recommencing C award assessments after the summer break when the winter leagues restart.

#### **B Award Practical Assessments**

Due to injury, we have not had any B award qualifications this season but are hopeful for good progress next season as we have 16 umpires who are now working to their B umpire award. 9 hold the written paper and are working with mentors and 7 are still to sit the paper.

On passing their written papers, our working to B award umpires are invited to umpire Division 1 at NLNL and County League and work with a mentor to assist their pathways to qualification.

#### A Award Practical Assessments

We are delighted that Shaheen Lodhi has achieved her A umpire award this season.

We have 5 more umpires within Middlesex preparing for their A award next season; and another umpire who will join the London and South East Regional mentoring programme next season when they pass the A written paper.

#### **Assessors**

This season, England Netball launched their new Umpire Assessor accreditation course. Temi Olusi attended the course and has undertaken the appropriate observations to be accredited as an Into Officiating Assessor. Temi is now progressing to become a C umpire award assessor.

Bev Hackworth undertook her Assessor training pre-Covid and has now successfully been accredited as a C umpire award assessor.

Both Lisa Grimes and Sophie Scott both undertook Assessor training pre-Covid and we will look to finalise their accreditation as C umpire award assessors early in the new winter season.

With thanks to Nicola Allan, Carolyn Davies, Amber Derrien, Gwenda Boniface, Julia Mark and Annie Mckenna for their time and support in conducting Into and C award assessments this season.

#### Mentoring

Our formal County mentoring programme as well as our North London league and Queensnorth league mentoring schemes have continued this season.

With thanks to Nicola Allan, Sophie Scott, Zoey Dickson, Julia Mark, Amber Derrien, Carolyn Davies, Elz Eve and Temi Olusi for their support of our developing umpires this season.

England Netball plan to launch a new mentor accreditation workshop later this year. No further details are yet available.

# Middlesex Round of National Schools – 20 November 2022

18 umpires were provided for the Middlesex round which took place at LEH. It was a well organised day with a high standard of play.

#### League Round-up

#### County League

We continue to centrally allocate umpires for all divisions of the County League. Every fixture date is a challenge to fulfil but with the support of a core group of umpires and quite a few new umpires to the pool, we are able to maintain high standards of umpiring for our County League teams.

The high standard of indoor play within Premier and Division 1 continues to provide perfect opportunities for all our working to B and above umpires to progress their skills and enhance their protocols.

With central allocation across all the divisions, many of our working to B and above umpires also officiated matches in Division 2 and 3 this season and this gave the teams in those divisions experience of enhanced umpiring decisions as well as providing a great opportunity for our C award umpires to learn from our more experienced umpires. The camaraderie and continued growth of a community of umpires was great to see and has spurred a number of our umpires on to deciding to progress their qualifications to the next level and also enticed some new umpires to join the County League pool.

A huge thank you to the Middlesex umpire team who support me in the allocations and who deliver strong umpiring performances on every County league fixture date. I couldn't do it without your support!

#### • North London League

Arancha Heredero and Kym Rawlings jointly took on the role of umpire co-ordinator for the league this season. It has been a hard season trying to ensure cover for all divisions on each fixture date. The what's app umpire swap shop messaging system and google spreadsheet for teams to input their

umpires into continue to be assets for the teams to share umpires and try to have qualification appropriate umpires for games. It has however had an impact on the ability for many learner umpires to receive mentoring or be assessed as their game allocations have been switched around so much and often last minute, so that mentors cannot match up with them. Hopefully next season priority can be given to developing umpires to qualification rather than panic bargaining and switching umpires each week.

# • Queensnorth League

Nicola Allan has continued in the role of umpire co-ordinator for the league, allocating umpires for all matches across the three evenings of match play each week at Northwood College. Nicola does an excellent job and has built a strong team of committed umpires. She also provides mentor support for many of our working to C award umpires at the league.

## • Harlington League

This is being played at Bishopshalt as the courts at Harlington are being redeveloped. There continues to be limited communication with the umpire co-ordinator at the league.

#### **Bleep testing**

This season we continued to mirror England Netball and did not require umpires to fitness test for our leagues with the expectation that umpires will ensure they are fit enough for the standard of match they are officiating and observations have been undertaken to ensure high standards are maintained, particularly at the County league.

England Netball are now bringing back fitness testing so we will look to reintroduce our September and January bleep test submissions for County League; and encourage our member leagues to follow. Levels required and timings for bleep testing will be communicated in due course across the summer.

#### **Workshops and Forums**

We have held online B and A written paper workshops for those wishing to have assistance with preparing for the June 2023 paper sitting. Further workshops will be run if required for future sittings (October 2023, February 2024).

We will be running some forums and workshops at the start of the new 2023/24 winter season which we will expect all umpires to attend as well as representation from all clubs including coaches. All members of Middlesex will be very welcome to attend. These workshops will encompass reminders of performance expectations for all levels of umpires as well as focussing on rules and protocols which need clarity and knowledge of correct application; how to effectively manage the game; and requirements for managing stoppages.

#### County umpiring kit

We reintroduced our range of Flyhawk umpiring kit this season. We will be readvertising the kit for purchase in the summer ready for the new season.

#### **Technical Officials**

England Netball are due to launch a new Technical Officials course to encourage new officials which will enable the County to continue to grow our number of accredited and trainee Technical Officials who are involved in National Premier League, Super league, NPL and International matches on a regular basis.

Although has agreed to be available if needed. The group would like to thank Sally for all her efforts and contributions over the years.

#### Overview of Season 2022-2023

At the time of this report the season had not concluded so this reflects activity up to May 2023. The Middlesex Player Pathway ran trials for both U15 and U13 athletes. These were held at Brunel on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> September respectively.

The U15's session had nearly 100 athletes. 20 places were available, and athletes were selected, and a reserve list also created.

Over 90 athletes trialled for 40 places in the U13 Player Pathway and 40 were selected for the 2 pathways with 4 reserves added to a wait list.

Initial some issues with sign up prior to trials due to oversubscriptions. There will be a clear approach for the coming seasons and clear communication of dates and cut off points.

Player Pathway sessions were from October 2022 to May 2023 at Godolphin & Latymer and South Hampstead High Schools with an induction for all athletes that took place on the 25<sup>th of</sup> September 2022 at Trailfinders in Ealing.

Assistant coaches; Sophie Nicholas, Miracle Kaddu, Shanaide Basquine, Candice Trumpet and Amy Winter.

New kit by Flyhawk provided to all coaches and athletes.

Middlesex were unable to send a squad to participate in the Pulse festival in held on  $2^{nd}$  of April. But did participate in the regional festival on the  $26^{th of}$  March 2023. Unfortunately, the festival was abandoned due to bad weather.

## **England Netball**

Middlesex completed and submitted their SLA to EN as well as its programme delivery plan and budget cost for Player Pathway Programme.

2x U13's

1x U15's

MCNA once again subsidised the player pathway programme. Fee issues for some players and so MCNA asked to consider how we cover so as to ensure no athlete misses out on the opportunity on offer. EN requested all athletes be registered in Engage which provided difficulties but was managed successfully. Feedback to EN on this for the future.

As part of the SLA Middlesex were required to create a selection policy which is now been developed and is available alongside all player pathway documents on the County's website.

#### Franchise

Middlesex County as part of EN agreement is aligned to London Pulse. However, our athletes can attend any of the Franchises they wish.

Over the season work has been done to improve communications with London Pulse and this remains on-going.

LP U15 Academy stage 1 trials will be held on the 12<sup>th of</sup> February 2023. Middlesex currently have 7 athletes in the U15 Academy Stage 1 long squad;



London Pulse held a come and play day on the 11<sup>th of</sup> December 2022 at the Score. Athletes from Kent and Essex also took part. Middlesex represented with 2 x U13 and 1x U15 group. The day was a great success all around with many athletes performing well and enjoying a day of netball.

Pulse invited athletes to a shooting clinic on the 5<sup>th of</sup> January 2023. Middlesex were able to provide the opportunity for 3 athletes, 2 of which were able to attend. One athlete stood out and Middlesex performance group and was offered a place within the nearest Pulse PDP and so be able to access trials to the U15 academy.

Stage 2 trials to be held in June 2023. Counties can nominate 3 athletes for these trials in addition to those already invited from stage 1.

# Resolution Lead Report Claire Kean

This season we have seen England Netball's New Disciplinary/Resolution Process really come into effect. The main change being that the majority of complaints now fall within England Netball's remit and are directly sent to them. Under previous regulations the County itself would deal with most complaints.

In addition, all leagues within the County, have, on the whole managed all other complaints locally that don't fall with the EN Remit. This has allowed for a more informal and speedy resolution when needed, whilst the option is there for more serious and usually Code of Conduct or Safeguarding related matter to be escalated more quickly and dealt with completely out of County/Region.

This season Middlesex Resolution has on the whole been mainly a source of guidance and clarification, dealing with enquiries and signposting. There have been three cases that the County itself has resolved either internally or via independent neutral panels, out of County, but within the Region.

We would like to remind all clubs to ensure that all players, coaches and spectators are familiar with their responsibilities under the EN Codes of Conduct, in particular with regard to the treatment of umpires, opposing players and the safeguarding of young players, as these are common areas that are normally the source of most complaints.

This season saw the introduction of the Swords Awards to acknowledge the challenging work of our volunteers within Middlesex.

We have always recognised and appreciated the work of our volunteers; however, with the Swords Awards we want to raise the profile and celebrate the achievements of our volunteers.

We started with the introduction of the online nomination forms in a simplified google form format to make it easier, and more accessible for people to nominate candidates. The nominations opened on the 25<sup>th</sup> January 2023 and closed on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

Within the 4-week window, we received a total of 15 nominations across the 11 awards: The categories for nominations

#### Coach of the Year Swords Award Children and Young Adults - Melissa Wright

Mel has been part of the fabric of Middlesex netball for nearly 10 years as a coach, umpire, and volunteer. Mel is a netball coach at Starz netball club since its inauguration in 2019; she is a founding member of the club, which covers teams from under 11's through to under 15's age groups. Mel understands the importance of exposing young athletes to challenging netball, and environments that will increase their knowledge, skills, and love of the game. Mel strongly believes that athletes learn best from experience and training sessions structured to maximise teaching through match scenarios. Athletes are appropriately challenged for the full length of their training sessions through a combination of match play, skills development, and fun games. The athletes are empowered to lead parts of the training sessions and are asked to provide feedback regarding what works well and what needs improvement. Additionally, to meet the needs of a rapidly growing club, Mel has mentored three coaches in attaining their level 2 coaching qualifications. The impact of Mel's coaching is evidenced by the success of the club and the athletes.

#### Middlesex Sonia Taylor Coach of the Year Swords Award Adults - Gemma Holland

Gemma Holland has been coaching for 18 years, she is the head coach for Falcons netball club, which she established in 2005 with a friend. Initially starting with one team, Gemma has since seen the club grow into three adult teams, seven youth teams for ages 11-16 and a development training session for players aged 9-16, plus a new Mini Falcons session for boys and girls aged 3-8 years old. Gemma supports her players to reach their playing goals and is always on hand to support her teams. Her YouTube channel 'Falcons Netball Club' has fitness, drills, and skills for netball, to support the team. Gemma encourages and motivates her players to be better.

#### Partnership Updates & Other News

**Bee Netball** – In September 2022, Middlesex launched two Trailblazer Bee Netball Clubs: AP Saints (8 Bee Netball members) and NBNC Flames (17 Bee Netball members).

**Netball Youth Camps** - Two successful Netball Youth Camps have run at Alec Reed Academy, Northolt, engaging 22 participants. The next camp is scheduled at the same location for 1<sup>st</sup> June.

**Wembley National Stadium Trust** – In April 2023 we received grant funding from the Wembley National Stadium Trust to fund the continuation of our 'Brent Project', supporting the development of netball coaches living or working in Brent.

**Playzones Project** – The Football Foundation's Playzones project provides an opportunity for the refurbishment of existing or development of new multi-sport Playzones. We are involved in discussions with several different boroughs' consortiums. If a demand for netball is identified in the community engagement these consortiums carry out, then there may be an opportunity for some facility development in these areas.

**University Netball Development Festival** – In March 2023 we held a University Development Festival open to any non-BUCS university netball teams in London. Over 80 participants attended, with teams from London universities including Queen Mary, Imperial College, Barts and the London School of Medicine and Dentistry, Kings College London, and LSE.
